- Maintenance of open and frequent contact with the parents, referring issues to the program manager, or the Out of School Care Coordinator in the absence of the manager
- Organize, program plan, problem solve, and generally maintain a well-run care facility for children
- Ensure provision of varied programs of creative activities, outings and supervised play, to meet the needs of the children in the program
- Maintain licensing standards, being fully aware of VIHA policies and procedures

- Ensure that the program room and equipment are clean and in good repair, this includes wiping tables, dish washing, etc. (daily and weekly duties)
- Help to prepare healthy snacks
- Attend staff meetings to program plan, organize and problem solve
- Model appropriate staff behavior for other staff and volunteers
- Discuss any noted staff problems with the supervisor
