

DANDELION PLAYDOUGH

Do your kids love picking dandelions? Turn them into fun by making naturally dyed play dough!

Ingredients

- 1 cup yellow dandelions packed
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- ¾ cup salt
- 4 tsp cream of tartar2 cups water
 - 2 tbsp vegetable oil



- Instructions
 Use a knife to cut off the yellow petals from each dandelion, discarding the stems.
- Set aside 2-3 tablespoons of dandelion petals (optional to add later for more texture), then pour the water into a blender and add the remaining dandelions. Run the blender for 20-30 seconds, until most of the dandelions have been pulverized and the water has turned yellow.
- Combine the flour, salt and cream of tartar in a medium wok. If you have set aside some of the chopped dandelions, mix those in as well.
- Add water and vegetable oil and stir until combined.
- Cook on medium heat, stirring constantly, until the mixture becomes a ball of dough that no longer sticks to the sides of the wok. This should take no more than 5 minutes.
- Set the play dough aside to cool. Once it's cool enough, knead it with your hands until smooth. Then, give it to your child to play with!






ChildCareBC Pedagogy Services Town Hall with Parliamentary Secretary Arora

The Ministry of Education and Child Care is seeking feedback from early childhood professionals on accessing pedagogical services and resources. The Early Childhood Pedagogy Program, operated by the Early Childhood Pedagogy Network, offers support through a network of pedagogists that work directly with educators in child care programs, community learning circles and other professional development opportunities and through connections with Child Care Resource and Referral Centres. Their work is guided by B.C.'s Early Learning Framework.

<u>Register</u> by June 9 for the virtual Pedagogy Services Town Hall on Tuesday, June 10 with Rohini Arora, parliamentary secretary for child care, where you will have the opportunity to share your feedback on pedagogy services directly with the Parliamentary Secretary.
